The following content outlines the specific and measurable actions and initiatives that will be completed during the 2014-2015 academic year.

Create a comprehensive, centralized unit for student support services.

December 2014

- ☐ Create a separate College dedicated to student success.

 The College will be known as University College and will have overarching responsibility for student academic support, professional readiness, retention initiatives and University advising.
- Hire a dean for University College.
- ☐ Appoint an advising "czar" to oversee and coordinate all University advising.

 Create a comprehensive advising plan for implementation in Fall 2015.

Increase the number of full-time faculty members and academic advisors.


