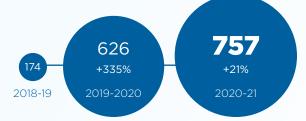
Curricular and co-curricular engagement

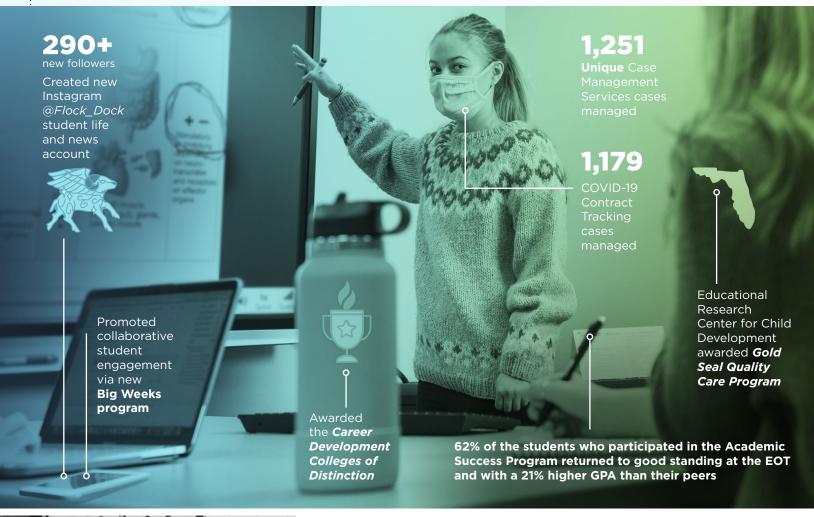
As a result of purposeful outreach, 3,063 total Freshmen engaged in Recreation.

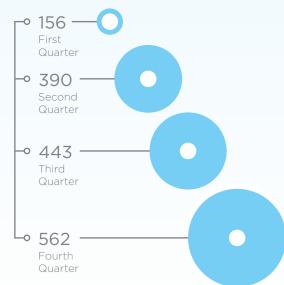

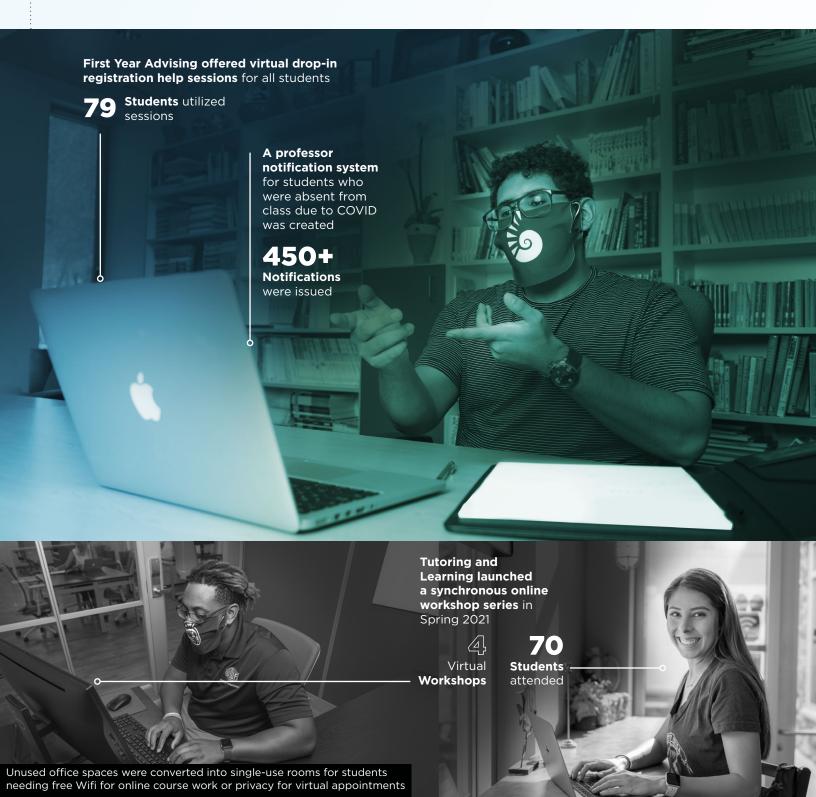


Leading through the Pandemic:
