The University of West Florida Center for Applied Psychology is hosting the combined Council of Applied Master's Programs in Psychology/Northamerican Association of Masters in Psychology Nov. 5 through Nov. 7 at the Bowden Building, 120 Church Street, Pensacola. The conference begins with registration at 8 a.m. The schedule includes presentations on the future of master's education in psychology, accreditation of master's programs, internships in industrial-organizational programs and licensure for master's practitioners. Catherine Grus from the American Psychological Association's Education Directorate will lead the “Students with Competence Programs: Assessment Methods, Resources and Considerations” workshop Thursday, Nov. 5, beginning at 9 a.m. This workshop is available for continuing education credit as are two other workshops to be held Saturday, Nov. 7, which include topics such as clinician work-life balance and psychological trauma and domestic violence. The cost to attend all three days is \$190 per person. The fee to attend the Grus workshop is \$45 per person. The cost to attend the CAMPP/NAMP conference is \$70 per person. The cost to attend the NAMP session with two optional workshops listed above is \$90. Students pay \$10 per day. Open registration continues through Oct. 30.
