

Course Transfer Policy:

Due to our desire to have our students successfully navigate our program, meet its outcomes, and become successful engineers when they graduate, we are very strict on the transferability of courses. The following is our policy regarding the transfer of courses into our program:

1. We abide by the recommendations of the office of admissions at UWF in regards to the general education requirements (English, humanities, and social science requirements).
 2. Math, science, and engineering will be transferred from other state universities and colleges according to the rules of common course numbering as determined by the state of florida (prefix and last 3 digits of the course must match, and the school must have the appropriate accreditation).
 3. For math and science courses from outside the state of florida or non-state institutions, the courses must be from properly accredited schools (as determined by the UWF office of admissions). Students will supply suitable descriptions to their advisor to show that the course content and level covers the proper material for the student to successfully complete subsequent courses. If there is a question, the student may be required to supply more information so that the corresponding department can determine if the course is equivalent.
 4. All courses must meet minimum grade requirements as set by the ECE department at UWF.
 5. In no case will credits from a technology program be transferred as engineering credits.
 6. In no case will electrical and computer engineering credits from non-ABET accredited programs be transferred as engineering credits at UWF.
 7. The computer science department will determine the equivalence of computer science (courses with CEN and COP prefixes) related courses required in the computer engineering program. Please see your academic advisor to start the procedure for transferring these courses.
 8. Engineering courses (courses with EEE, EEL, EGN, EGM, EIN prefixes at UWF) from quality, ABET accredited programs will be considered for transfer on a case by case basis. Students will be required to supply sufficient information for the department to determine if the course is indeed equivalent. A maximum of 2 electrical engineering courses (EEE and EEL prefixes at UWF, not including EEL 4834) and corresponding labs will be accepted from ABET accredited universities which are not part of the common course numbering system. Transfer students should see their advisor for additional information on procedures and policies for transferring courses into our program.
