### **UWF Nautilus Dance Institute to Hold First Annual Dance Workshop**

The UWF Nautilus Dance Institute will hold its first annual dance workshop June 29 and 30. The event is designed to promote dance education, fitness and fun and will be hosted by the UWF Health, Leisure and Exercise Science Department (HLES). The event is open to the public and prices vary depending on age group and participation.

### **UWF to Offer Web Design Course Using Dreamweaver, Photoshop**

The UWF Division of Continuing Education will offer "Web Design: Dreamweaver and Photoshop" Tuesdays beginning April 3 through 24 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. on the UWF Main Campus. The enrollment fee is \$99 per person. Dave Dawson, director of education and training for the UWF Division of Engineering and Computer Technology, will conduct the class.

"The creation of images for use on the Web poses some special challenges and raises some specific issues for the graphic designer," said Dawson. "Aspects of human perception are very important to Web design and production decisions."

The course will address the technical aspects of color models, digital file formats, compression methods, scaling and strategies for implementing images on Web pages. Specific methods and techniques for using Adobe Photoshop and Adobe Dreamweaver to produce Web pages optimized for performance, platform compatibility, ADA compliance and aesthetic impact will also be addressed.

Dawson is a leader in the implementation of the Information Engineering Technology program in a PDA environment and has served as chief technologist for the UWF College of Professional Studies. He is also co-inventor of a reusable learning object-based instructional design system that is patent-pending and has been licensed for commercialization.
