"Living, eating, practicing and performing on the UWF campus will provide prospective young musicians with a musical immersion experience."

Ensembles will include chorus, band, string orchestra, opera studio and chamber music. Private lessons in individual areas of study will also be offered. Merit-based scholarships for \$50 and \$100 are available. For scholarship consideration, applications must be received no later than June 1. Students will present a concert July 27 at 7 p.m., which is free and open to the public.

### **Historic Pensacola Village Offers History-Inspired Summer Camps for Kids**

West Florida Historic Preservation, Inc. (WFHPI) will offer two weeks of history-inspired camps for children going into grades four through seven. Sessions will be offered June 18 through 22 and July 16 through 20 from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The cost is \$80 per camper. A discounted price will be offered for those who register before June 1 or for those who are members of WFHPI.

"History Camp is an excellent way for inquisitive boys and girls to discover local history by hands-on participation, creativity and exploration," said Dena Bush, camp director. "Camp at Historic Pensacola Village provides a unique opportunity for participants to immerse themselves in the past. It is not only a fun experience for campers but is educational in nature and allows them to learn while having a good time!"

The first two days of camp will focus on the frontier nature of Colonial Pensacola. Campers will take a tour of the 1805 Spanish Colonial Lavalley House and receive hands-on demonstrations related to colonial living, participating in crafts and games, butter making, quill pen writing, soldier drilling and contra-dancing. Wednesday will be devoted to archaeology, with an exploration of the Colonial Archaeological Trail and the Florida Public Archaeology Network archaeology lab. The last two days of camp will focus on the beginning of modern America. Campers will discover how life changed due to technology and innovation during the Victorian period, at the turn of the 20th century and continued to develop into the "Roaring Twenties." Campers will take a tour of the 1890 Lear-Rocheblave House, Museum of Commerce and 1920s Manual Barrios Cottage and will participate in Victorian crafts, games and period-appropriate activities.

WFHPI is a direct support organization of the University of West Florida. The mission of WFHPI is to function as a public and educational institution for the enrichment and benefit of the community. Historic Pensacola Village consists of 21 properties in the Pensacola National Register Historic District. Eleven of these properties are open to the public.
