UWF Department of Music to Offer Summer High School Music Camp

The UWF Department of Music, in partnership with the Pensacola Opera, will offer a summer music camp for high school students, ages 14 to 18, July 22 through 27

on the UWF Main Campus. The base registration fee is \$200 per person, with additional fees for housing, meal plans and private lessons. The application **deadline is June 29.**

"UWF's Summer High School Music Camp is an opportunity for young musicians to be instructed by our prestigious faculty and staff," said Kyle Marrero, chair of the UWF Department of Music. "Living, eating, practicing and performing on the UWF campus will provide prospective young musicians with a musical immersion experience."

Classes will include "Music Theory," "Ear Training/Sight Singing," "Class Piano," "Stage Movement," "Music History/Literature," "Jazz Fundamentals/Improv," "Music Computers/Technology" and "Beginning Conducting." Ensembles will include chorus, band, string orchestra, opera studio and chamber music. Private lessons in individual areas of study will also be offered. As an "All Steinway School," UWF will offer camp participants the opportunity to utilize 18 new Steinway pianos.

Merit-based scholarships for \$50 and \$100 are available. For scholarship consideration, applications must be received no later than June 1. Students will present a concert July 27 at 7 p.m., which is free and open to the public.

UWF Division of Continuing Education will offer “**Project Management Professional (PMP)**” and “**Lean Mastery**” online certification and training programs.

“Project Management Professional” is a five-week, 40-hour course. The tuition is \$1,595 per person. This course teaches the basics of project management and includes preparation for the PMP national certification exam. Course materials and exam preparation are included in the cost. There are no prerequisites for this course, but the PMP Exam requires a bachelor's degree and 4,500 hours of project management experience in addition to this course, or a high school diploma or general education development diploma and 7,500 hours of project management experience in addition to this course. Frank Greenwood, author and a project management professional, will conduct the class.

“Lean Mastery” is an eight-week, 60-hour course. The tuition is \$1,795 per person. Course materials are included in the cost. This course will cover information on transforming a business enterprise to Lean. Lean Enterprise is a process designed to bring about rapid, step-change improvements to the performance of an organization through an overhaul of the value stream. The program includes examples, photographs, graphics, quizzes, progress tests, case studies and many interactive features that provide tips, “try this” exercises and in-depth information. The program covers all Lean Enterprise concepts. Brian Furlong, a seasoned senior executive with 30 years experience in manufacturing and finance, will conduct this class.
