














Luggage Tag Tutorial

	<p>Create pattern 6 inches long from tip of pointed end to opposite edge 2.75 inches wide From straight edge to beginning of angle to form tip: 5 inches</p>
	<p>Cut out 2 pieces of broadcloth</p>
	<p>Cut 1 piece of 2.5" ribbon – 6 inches long</p>
	<p>Embroider the ribbon as desired</p>
	<p>Center the Ribbon on broadcloth, with point to the left and stitch. This will be the top.</p>
	<p>Cut rectangle of plastic same size as broadcloth omitting the pointed end. Place plastic onto broadcloth, having straight edges even.</p>
	<p>Stitch short edge, using tissue paper to keep plastic from sticking</p>

	<p>Trim plastic to 1/8 inch. Place broadcloth with plastic on top of front, right sides together. Fold over a quarter inch on the short end of top and bottom.</p>
	<p>Stitch, leaving short (straight) end open for turning. Be sure to back-stitch at beginning and end.</p>
	<p>Turn and press. Hand or machine stitch closed the short end.</p>
	<p>Using scissors cut a small X where you want to place the grommet. Dab with FrayChek</p>
	<p>Using a hammer and grommet tool (or grommet pliers if you can find one of the several pair you have!), install the grommet.</p>
	<p>Put the luggage tag holder on and you're done! Now, wasn't that fun?</p>
<p>I'm making 15 of these for stocking stuffers, so I'm also printing out business card sized name/address labels. If you're planning on selling them at a bazaar, you could put YOUR business card in each.</p>
