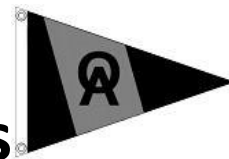

Skipper Certification Days – The First Sunday of Every Month

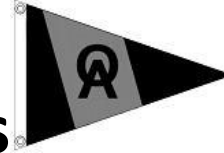
Sailing Attendant Preparation ²	9am to 10am

What Can I Do?

No Experience: “Sailing with Outdoor Adventures” on the Hunter 23

- Sign-up downstairs in the HLS building at the facilities desk
- Free to all UWF students, faculty, and staff

Basic Boater Certification: Crew on a 420 and the Hobie Getaway

- Given on Saturdays and Sundays from 10am to 11am (weather permitting)
- No prerequisites required

420 Skipper Certification: Check-out a 420 and take along a friend that has the basic boater certification

- Given on the first Sunday of every month (weather permitting)
- Prerequisite: Basic Boater Certification

Hobie Skipper Certification: Check-out the Hobie Getaway and take along up to three friends that have their basic boater certifications

- Given on the first Sunday of every month (weather permitting)
- Prerequisite: Basic Boater Certification

Laser Skipper Certification: Check-out a Laser for a day of single handing

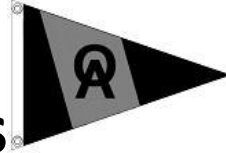
- Given on the first Sunday of every month (weather permitting)

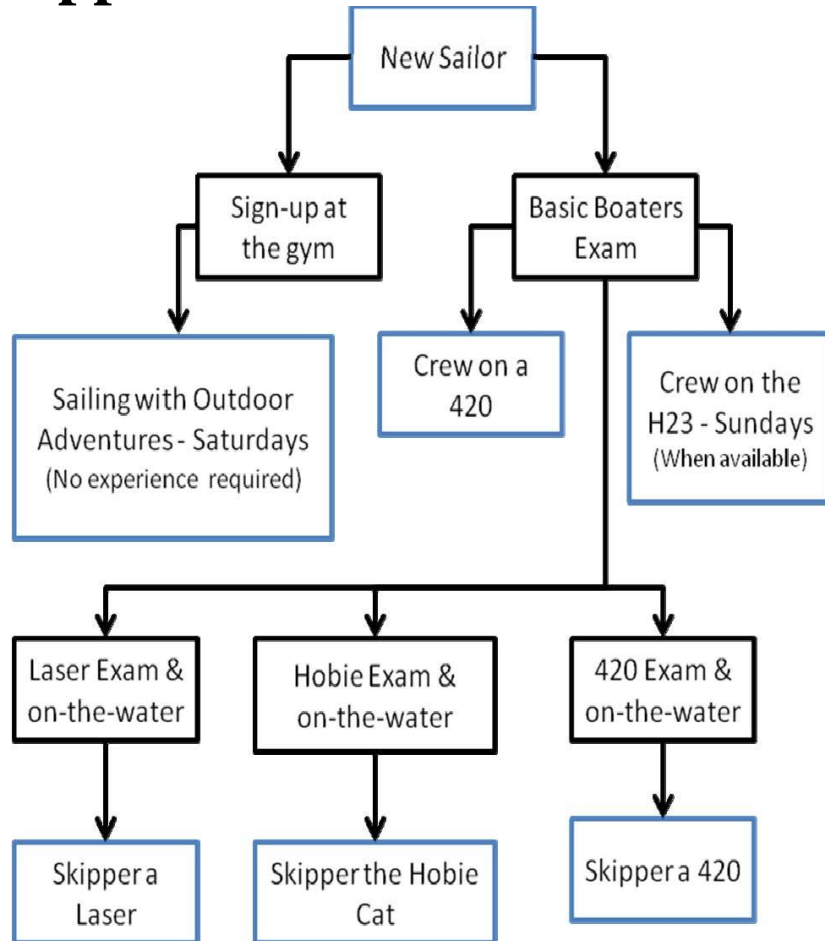

Skipper Certification Flow Chart

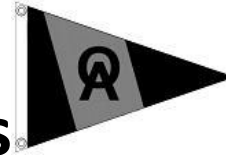


General Guidance for Certifications:

- All certifications will be available during regularly scheduled walk-in hours y Written exams may be taken at PYC during the scheduled time
- Study materials are available online for download, please email OutdoorAdventure@uwf.edu for the link
- Exams may be taken as many times as needed; however, you must wait at least 24 hours before attempting to retest
- On-the-water exams will be given on the first Sunday of every month at PYC (weather permitting)
- Participants are responsible for arranging for their own crew

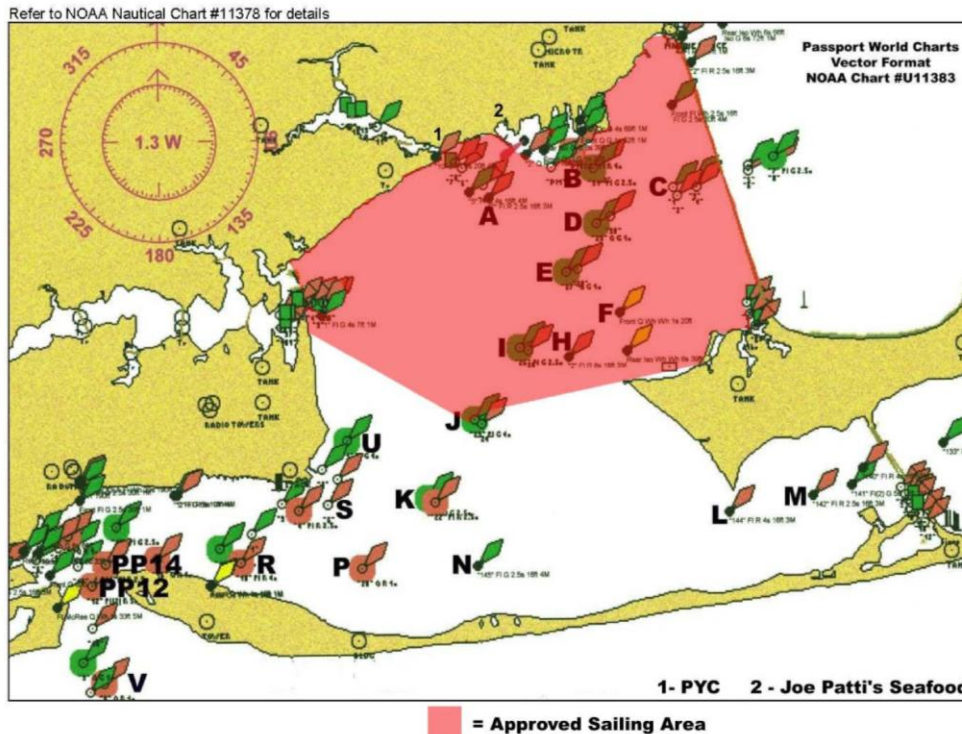

UWF Sailing Area

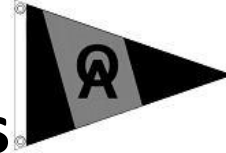


General Guidance for Certified Skippers:

- All boats are required to have a functional VHF radio on board at all times
- Every effort should be made to be safe and avoid risk while out on the water
 - For example: avoid barges, return to PYC if the conditions becomes unsafe, and report problems immediately to the sailing attendant on duty
 - Skippers exhibiting poor judgment and/or unsafe actions can have their skipper certification revoked on the spot
- The Hobie Cat, 420s, and Lasers should sail together as a fleet as to watch out for each other's safety
- Skippers are required to have all equipment cleaned and turned-in by the end of the schedule equipment
- check-in time; failure to do so may result in a suspension of privileges
 - Skippers should consider wind and weather conditions when planning, lack of wind is not an excuse for late equipment check-in
 - Skippers are responsible for arranging for their own crew

Sailing with OA

- Cost
 - Free to all students, faculty, and staff
 - Participants who do not have their nautilus card will be charged a \$5 non-student fee (cash only)
 - Guest will be charged a \$5 non-student fee and must be listed on the sign-up sheet along with their sponsors
- Sign-up
 - Downstairs in the HLS building at the customer service desk
 - Because space is limited, we ask that you please email OutdoorAdventure@uwf.edu if you can't attend
 - Please note: repeated 'no shows' may result in a loss of privileges
- When
 - Saturdays starting at 10:00am
 - Expect to be on the water from approximately 11:00am to 3:00pm
- Where
 - Meet at the Pensacola Yacht Club: 1897 Cypress St, Pensacola, FL 32502
 - Parking is available in the 'Members' parking lot
 - Wait for a UWF sailing instructor in front of the Sailing Center
 - Please note: Participants are responsible for arranging their own transportation
- Recommended equipment
 - Hot Weather: bathing suit, t-shirt, shorts, towel, dry clothes, closed toed shoes, water or sports drinks, a snack, sunscreen, hat, and sunglasses
 - Cold Weather: warm clothing (avoid cotton - fleece is the best), dry clothes, extra socks, closed toed shoes, chap stick, hat, sunglasses, closed toed shoes, water or sports drinks, and a snack
- Cancellations
 - Sailing may be cancelled at any time depending on the weather
 - You will receive an email by 8:00pm Friday night if sailing is cancelled due to an unfavorable weather forecast; otherwise, we will attempt to sail the next morning
