Volleyball:

- *Most wins in UWF Volleyball history, with 32-7 season
- *12-0 in regular season GSC play – East Division Champions
- *Earned berth in the NCAA South Regional for second consecutive year
- *Melissa Wolter earned the GSC Coach of the Year award
- *Luciana Rapach became the first UWF volleyball player to earn All-American selection. Rapach was the GSC East Division Player of the Year, and a member of the All-South Regional team.

Women's Soccer:

- *GSC Regular Season Champs, Runner's up in GSC Tournament
- *Earned berth in the NCAA Regionals
- *The team had the conference's second highest team total of 16 athletes make the first team and honor roll for the GSC All-Academic awards.
- *Dernelle Mascall sets single season record with 23 goals. Earned First Team Daktronics All-American Honors, earned first team All-Regional and first team All-GSC.
- *Courtney Jones was a first team All-GSC selection, and an Honorable Mention All-American.

Men's Soccer:

- *Undefeated in Conference play, and GSC Tournament Champions
- *Earned berth in the NCAA Regionals
- *Won team record 18 straight matches
- *Two NSCAA All-American Selections:

Men's Basketball:

*Earned three of the six First Team ALL-GSC Academic Team, with Tyler Fleming (3.81 GPA), Lucas Evangelista (3.69 GPA), and David Maddux (3.93 GPA). The selections put UWF in some elite company. Tyler is graduating early, and has been accepted into Dental School at Tufts University in Boston. He is majoring in Pre-Professional Biology, and boasts a 3.81 GPA.

Women's Basketball:

*Recorded a conference best with nine athletes named to the GSC Honor Roll for Academics:

*UWF Women's Basketball had the most representatives on the Gulf South Conference Honor Roll among all Winter Sports Teams in the conference.

Women's Golf:

*Captured third straight GSC title, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fifth consecutive year.

*Head Coach Robin Dezarn earned her third straight GSC Coach of the Year Award.

*Freshman Bhavna Shetty was named GSC Freshman of the year, and Co-Player of the year.

Men's Golf:

*Captured their third straight GSC Championship

*Won the NCAA South Regional Tournament

*Head Coach Steve Fell was named the GSC Coach of the Year for the ninth time in his 14 years as head coach.

*Galloway also earned the 2008 Cleveland Golf Scholar All-America Award

*Rosendahl was named to the Phil Mickelson All-Freshman Team

Men's Tennis:

*Argos ranked 3rd in the nation as a team, earned berth in the NCAA tournament, and advanced to the National Championships.

*Eduardo Cavasotti earns ITA All-American Honors for Singles

*Nicolas Barrientos was named the GSC Player of the Year.

Women's Tennis:

*The 16th ranked Argos earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament, and advanced to the National Championships

*Suzana Cavalcante is ranked third in the nation in singles, and was named the GSC Player of the Year for a record tying third straight year. Cavalcante could become the first athlete ever in any sport to earn the Gulf South Conference Player of the Year Award for four straight years, if she does it again next year in her senior season.

*Cavalcante was named the Arthur Ashe Sportsmanship award winner.
